## Wine List

### Champagne

*Taittinger Brut Réserve, NV*

France

*Made with a predominance of Chardonnay, this has an intensely fragrant character and is a unique non-vintage style. The flavour is delicate and the finish complex and long. Taittinger are the last major Grande Marque house still owned by the founding family.*

### Sparkling

*Prosecco, Sant Orsola, NV*

Italy

*Made from 100% Prosecco grown in the Vento region of north east Italy with it's particularly mild climate. Fine, persistent, soft fizz surrounds the typical fruit spectrum of apples, pears with a hint of peach.*

### White

*Pinot Noir (Vinified White) Provincia di Pavia Terre D'Alteni, La Versa, 2008/9*

Italy

*Pale yellow with not a hint of pink showing its red grape heritage: nuances of white fruits and fresh flowers on the nose, the palate shows a persistently fruity finish.*

*Etchart Privado Torrontés, Salta, 2009/10*

Argentina

*Torrontes is thought to have originated in north-western Spain but today is unique to Argentina. Although widely grown, the finest examples are from the high altitude vineyards of Salta in northern Argentina. The wines are typically fragrant. Usually unoaked, they are best drunk 1-2 years of harvest. Fresh, floral and dry.*

*Cono Sur Organic Sauvignon Blanc*

Chile

*Young and fresh, this wine has a nice pale yellow colour with green hints. Its intense nose of citric aromas like grapefruit and green pepper notes anticipates a balanced and mineral mouth, of great acidity and persistence. Overall, this is an expressive, refreshing, delicate, juicy and balanced Sauvignon Blanc.*

*Flagstone Word of Mouth Viognier, Western Cape, 2008/9*

South Africa

*The grapes of this 100% Viognier come from the cool-climate regions of Elgin and Elim well-known for producing high quality fruit. Aromas of fresh, ripe watermelon and juicy peaches are encased on in a delicate hint of spice. Medium-bodied but with a richness to the palate, commonto Viognier, the wine finishes fresh again with hints of Oriental spice.*

*Villa Maria Cellar Selection Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, 2007/09*

New Zealand

*Selected fruit from the reserve vineyards within the Awaterere and Wairau Valleys have been cool fermented to produce an intense bouquet of sweet gooseberries, laced with citrus leaf characters, supported by a rich, fruity acidity and a lingering finish.*

*Cullen View, Chenin Blanc*

South Africa

*A white wine that is light and fresh, but quite full, creamy and round, with a peachy flavour. Chenin Blanc was previously referred to as Steen in South Africa, but now they have adopted the international name for this Loire grape variety.*

## **Rose**

*Belvino Pinot Grigio Rosato Delle Venezie, 2009/10*

Italy

*A delicate pink wine with full fresh, summer-fruit aromas and flavours. Made using pink-skinned Pinot Grigio grapes from the Venezie wine region. Cool-fermented in stainless steel after a brief maceration on the skins to extract sufficient colour.*

*Côtes du Rhône Rosé, Les Rabassières, 2009/10*

France

*Made predominantly from Grenache with Syrah making up the balance, the wine has a delicious strawberry and red fruit character. Whilst the flavours are ripe, the palate is dry and refreshing and, as such, this would make a very good rose to pair with food.*

## **Red**

*Fortant de France Merlot, Pays d'Oc, 2008/9*

France

*Fortant have selected the best grapes from the south of France and used 'New World' techniques to produce a full-driven wine with blackcurrant and raspberry flavours on the nose and palate.*

*Kleine Zalze Pinotage, Stellenbosch, 2008/9*

South Africa

*A deep coloured wine made from South Africa's 'own' grape variety. Excellent berry fruit flavours and soft tannins from vineyards located in the beautiful region of Stellenbosch. Pinotage is a variety developed in South Africa by crossing Cinsault and Pinot Noir. Found nowhere else, it makes some South Africa's most distinctive wines.*

*Cono Sur Organic Pinot Noir*

Chile

*Made from 100% Pinot Noir; appealing in its rich and deep bright red colour, with a complex and developed nose governed by sweet wild fruit aromas: notes of cherries and berries are enhanced by slight toasty hints. This Pinot definitely has a personality of its own; it's tasteful, with soft tannins.*

*Don Jacobo Rioja Crianza Tinto, Bodegas Corral, 2005/6*

Spain

*A traditional red Rioja very much Bodegas Corral's style, matured for a minimum of 12 months in oak followed by at least a year in bottle before release. 90% Tempranillo with small additions of the Garnacha and Mazuelo varieties.*

*Bourgogne Pinot Noir Couvent des Jacobins, Louis Jadot, 2006/07*

France

*A light-bodied, very elegant wine made in the heart of the Cote d'Or. Classic fresh strawberry aroma and soft, silky texture. Produced by the world-renowned Burgundy house of Jadot.*

*Mill Cellars Shiraz, South Eastern Australia*

Australia

*This Shiraz also has a little Cabernet Sauvignon in it to add some structure. Plenty of brambly fruit on the palate backed with a touch of spice.*
