Key Points – Sabbatical Officer Accountability

- *Stephanie Vallancey, Vice President Education:* If there is industrial action, Students' Association solidarity will depend on consultation with students.
- *Oona Miller, VP welfare:* Will pick up discussion around changing sanitary products to period or menstrual products when reviewed this year.
- *Rosheen Wallace, VP Community:* No plans yet to put a Zero Waste Shop in Kings' Buildings, developing it further depends on how well it goes in DHT.
- *Beth Fellows, VP Activities and Services:* Hoping to get non-academic events into student's calendars by next semester.
- *Andrew Wilson, President:* The Students' Association is working towards becoming a living wage employer

Key Points – Motions

- Motion to create a sustainable alternative to plastic cups in the student bars and clubs
 - PASSED with amendment to keep single use cup available and on display for use, which is necessary for disabled students
- Motion for elected officials' transparency and accountability
 - Amendment to reflect the Safe Space Policy and be subject to consultation by the Representation and Democracy Team PASSES
 - Amended motion sparks concern for the safety of Liberation Officers who fear aggressive holding to account
 - Proposer imagines that the voting records would only be available for students, not the general public
 - Motion receives 63.3% in favour, so will go to an ONLINE BALLOT
- Motion for supporting students impacted by universal credit
 - Motion PASSED unanimously
